Subject:- Allocation of Foodgrains for the month of February 2022 under National Food Security Act (NFSA)/ NPHH in favour of Kashmir Division (after recovery on a/c of Snow Bound/ Border Dumping).

Consequent upon the allotment of foodgrains made by Administrative Department vide above referred communication, sanction is hereby accorded to the:-

1. Lifting /Procurement of 208461.69 Qtls of Foodgrains viz; 198382.95 Qtls of Rice and 10078.74 Qtls of Wheat from FCI under NFSA/NPHH in favour of Assistant Director Stores FCS&CA Kashmir for the month of February 2022 as per the category wise breakup given below;

2. Release of 195808.35 Qtls of Foodgrains viz; 186467.84 Qtls of Rice and 9340.51 Qtls of Wheat under NFSA/ NPHH in favour of Assistant Directors of FCS&CA Kashmir Division by Assistant Director Stores/ Mills FCS&CA Kashmir for the month of February 2022 as per the district wise breakup given in Annexure "A" to this order.

The concerned Assistant Directors shall lift the entire released quantity and ensure its dispatch to the respective sale outlets by or before 31st of January 2021 for its further distribution amongst bonafide rationees through PoS devices only for the month of February 2022 within the stipulated time frame.

The above allocation is however, subject to the fulfillment of following terms and conditions that:-

1. No relaxation for additional allocation shall be considered in future under normal circumstances.
2. The allocated quantity is lifted from the specified loading point within the stipulated time frame as notified by the Administrative Department.
3. The Assistant Directors of the concerned districts will ensure that the distribution shall be made only through PoS devices strictly as per their entitlement of the identified beneficiaries in compliance of the instructions of Administrative Department.
4. The flying squad of officials of FCS&CA Department and Legal Metrology Department be constituted particularly in these Districts to monitor the distribution of ration and working of PoS machines.
5. The monthly lifting / off-take statements as per prescribed format should invariably be furnished to this directorate regularly by 5th of every month without any fail.

6. No Diversion/ re-appropriation from one scheme to another one category to another is allowed and the ration should be issued only to the bonafide rationees after proper identification and on cash payment specified by the government for each category under NFSA Act.
7. The Assistant Directors shall draw advance centre-wise roster/requirement of different commodities as per the format in vogue and shall submit a copy of the same to this Directorate for prior approval, before issuance of ration among the consumers.
8. The Assistant Directors shall be personally responsible for proper distribution of ration amongst the bonafide consumers as per the data generated under NFSA
9. The Assistant Directors shall keep strict vigil against pilferage and overcharging reported at any sale outlets.
10. The Assistant Directors shall furnish the information regarding daily lifting and dispatches of foodgrains to the Directorate on the following day without any fail.
11. The sale records shall be deposited in the respective piece checking section for inspection and records by 5th of the following month after conduct of sale of the foodgrains.
12. The sale proceeds shall be deposited as per the norms/procedure in vogue after completion of the distribution of foodgrains by 5th of the following month positively.
13. The un-lifted quantity, if any, owing to failure by any District, shall be correspondingly deducted from the next month's allocation and the un-lifted quantity shall not be re-allotted during the next month.
14. The entire quantity for a particular centre out of the above allocation due for the month, shall be dumped in one go, as per FIFO methodology.
15. The under-scaling of rations if any, shall be treated as misappropriation and embezzlement.
16. The TSO/storekeeper/FP Shop dealers shall ensure distribution of foodgrains to the identified beneficiaries under the Act.
17. The Storekeeper shall deposit the sale records signed by village Heads/Mohalla Heads duly countersigned by TSO concerned.
18. The TSO/ storekeeper shall maintain the acquaintance Rolls/ Register.
19. A separate physical/financial account should be maintained.
20. The ADs shall ensure implementation of the above terms and conditions in letter and spirit. Deviation, if any, shall attract disciplinary action against the erring officer.
